Add Energy Star appliances and the home's operational costs are indeed easy on the wallet. The Constellation 5 is also easy on the eye, with a design that includes all the must-haves together with a flexible floor plan that makes full use of every inch of space.

Base price for the Constellation 5 is \$204,900. The model home, with all the bells and whistles, goes for \$258,580. The 2,175-square-foot residence features four bedrooms, three baths and a den. The guest suite includes a full private bath.

"You can bring in your in-laws or your parents and they will have plenty of privacy," said Sietsma Forest.

The only problem could be they may not want to leave.

in one floor, so you don't have to go upstairs," said Sietsma Forest.

The Showcase Home sports tile floors in all the wet areas, oak, maple or cherry cabinetry, granite countertops, sprinkler system and storm shutters for all glass openings.

The Constellation 5's open plan, which flows from dining area to living room and family room, is centered on the kitchen, which includes an expansive walk-in pantry.

"We get a lot of comments about how large our walk-in pantry is," said Sietsma Forest.

"You have plenty of room to stock up from BJ's or Sam's."
